The Roseboro Fire Department is currently accepting applications for volunteer membership. The following are some things to take into consideration when thinking about applying:

- Must be 18 years of age to apply;
- Must have a valid NCDL.

That's it!

There is no prior training or experience required, you will work and train with us once you join. These are the steps necessary to become a member:

- 1. Fill out Town of Roseboro application;
- 2. Receive call from Fire Chief to set up time to meet with membership committee;
- 3. Have informal meet and greet with the membership committee;
- 4. Fire Chief will call you and advise you of your application status, if you were approved, you will receive further instructions;
- 5. Obtain copy of criminal history, get a drug test done, and have a physical. All of these will be reimbursed to you once you are a member.
- 6. Once these items have been turned over to the Fire Chief and meet his approval, you will be approved for membership.

Once you are on the department, you will serve a 90 probationary period, this time is for you to decide if you think being a firefighter is the right fit for you. You also use this time to get to know everyone on the department and start to learn what firefighting is all about. If you decide that either you don't think it's for you, or you don't have the time necessary, then you may resign in good standing and can return anytime in the future if you wish.
